We are seeking proposals for several categories, including workshops, presentations, posters, panelists, and full-paper research presentations.

Submission Instructions:

Proposals for workshops, presentations, posters, or to be a panel member should be via the online submission as posted on the SIEC-ISBE.org website. **Please** use this <u>form</u>. The deadline to submit is **March 31, 2024.** Alternatively, a SIEC-ISBE member can contact their local SIEC-ISBE professional development committee member for assistance.

The Reviewers' Board of the PDC Committee will evaluate the submissions and select those for inclusion in the conference program 2024. Presentation Requirements:

- Can address the conference theme or related topics relevant for business educators—research track (full paper research topics) and teaching practicum track—please specify clearly in your submission
- Limited to a 45-minute session
- Is a topic of immediate interest to participants
- Consists of a presentation (between 30 and 40 minutes) and discussion
- Can be used as a round table from different countries to present a shared project

Workshop Requirements:

- Must address the conference theme
- Limited to a 75-minute session
- Consists of an introduction, discussion, and/or activity
- Is an interactive session
- Provides 20-30 minutes for an overview with the remainder of the session being an interactive activity.
 Participants are expected to be involved.

Poster Requirements:

- Can be research- or practice-based
- May be from an educational institution and provide information about programs or projects
- Should be a topic that is of immediate interest to the participants
- Include a short introduction with a poster session.

Professional Development Panelist Requirements:

- Poses opportunities and challenges in aspects of artificial intelligence as relevant to teaching—may include policies, regulations, legal issues, project ideas, etc
- Presents for 5-10 minutes, plus time is allowed for taking audience questions
- Is an interactive session
- Is limited to a 60-minute session for a maximum of five panelists chosen
- May present challenges and solutions for effectively foreseeing changes in policy, regulations, legislation, and how faculty and schools may need to alter teaching techniques, evaluation, etc
- Due to time restrictions, plans now are for only one panel the topic being teaching tips and artificial intelligence.

The deadline to submit a full paper for consideration is February 29, 2024. A decision will be made by April 15, 2024.

Full-Paper Research Presentations:

- Must follow the overall conference theme. Papers related to artificial intelligence, disruptive technologies, virtual reality, engagement, societal impact, and similar topics will be given first consideration.
- May submit a completed research project following the submission guidelines for the International Journal for Business Education or submit an extended abstract (include objective, methods, results, conclusions, and bibliography). The 95th SIEC International Conference



This summer, SIEC-ISBE International is once again hosting a fully in-person conference. Our first since COVID.

As many remember, we cancelled our conference in 2020 due to the pandemic, only the third time in SIEC history has an annual conference been cancelled. The first two were during the world wars. In 2021, a small group of members went to Trieste, Italy, while most joined the online portion of the conference. In 2022, the Austrian Chapter hosted in Vienna with the

option for online attendance, and in 2023, the US Chapter hosted a fully online conference. This year, the US Chapter is hosting the 95th annual conference in Normal, Illinois, in the College of Business at Illinois State University.

The US Chapter invites you to join us as we celebrate 95 years of SIEC conferences. We are excited to have you join us in the beautiful State Farm Hall of Business (pictured above) on the campus of Illinois State University in Bloomington-Normal, Illinois.

The conference planning team has many professional development opportunities for you to enjoy. Our keynote speakers are experts in disruptive technologies. The company visits will be to local companies dedicated to sustainability, and the optional cultural tour will take you on a walk-through history as we explore the Lincoln Presidential Library and other historic sites in Springfield, Illinois. We have plans to visit Rivian Motors, an electric vehicle manufacturer, for one of the company tours, and the final details for the second company visit are being finalised.

The conference package includes all meetings, company visits with transportation, the welcome reception and dinner, coffee breaks, breakfast and lunch on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, and the Gala Dinner on Thursday evening.

The social package (for accompanying persons) will include breakfast, keynote speakers, the morning coffee break, company tours with transportation, and the evening events that are part of the conference package.

We offer an optional cultural tour to Springfield, Illinois, to visit the Lincoln Presidential Library, the Lincoln Homestead, and Lincoln's Tomb. Springfield is approximately one hour from Normal, and transportation will be provided.

Getting to Bloomington-Normal:

By air: International guests should fly into Chicago's O'Hare Airport. There is an airport in Normal, Illinois. Its code is BMI. If you fly into BMI, you must use Uber to travel from the airport to the hotel.

It is possible to take the Amtrak train from Chicago to Normal. More detailed information will be provided for taking the Amtrak in the conference materials available in early spring. I recommend taking the Amtrak. It is a two -hour journey from Chicago to Normal on the train, and you can see much of the surrounding landscape on your journey. The Amtrak station in Bloomington-Normal is directly across the street from our conference hotel, Marriott Hotel and Conference Center.

By car: Bloomington-Normal is located at the intersection of Interstate 55, Interstate 74, and Interstate 39, approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours north of St. Louis, Missouri, $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours south of Chicago, Illinois, and 3 hours west of Indianapolis, Indiana.

Writing a Structured Abstract

Have you ever wanted to enter a paper into a research forum or submit it to a journal that required a structured abstract but didn't know how to create one? First, what is a structured abstract? According to IEEE Professional Communication Society's website (2024)¹, structured abstracts provide

the readers with the key findings of a research paper and are like an executive summary.

A well-developed, structured abstract should be approximately 200-250 words long. The sections used in the abstract are typically discipline-specific. It is always best to consult the journal guidelines when preparing your abstract.

The Academic Skills unit at the University of Melbourne states, "Informative abstracts act as substitutes for the actual papers as all the key arguments and conclusions are presented; specifically, the context and importance of the research, reasons for methods, principal results and conclusions².

Structured abstracts can be divided into various sections. Including some basic information in the abstract is important, as outlined below.

The first section of your abstract should summarise why the research is important. Provide the background for your study. Include the key points from your literature review, but do not focus on the literature. When writing the abstract, the focus is on your work.

In the second section, describe the research problem or questions you are trying to solve. What is the thesis statement of your research? What are the aims of the research project? What are the key points you are trying to prove?

Describe the methodology used in the next section.

This could include the type of research conducted, your research model, theoretical perspective, how your participants were selected, data collection methods, and a description of the evidence you will gather to support your research questions. The methodology will need to be customised based on the specific type of research you are conducting.

Next, summarise the results of your research. This could be specific data or a more general statement of your findings. Remember, the abstract is limited to approximately 200-250 words.

Finally, describe your conclusions and the implications of your research. How can your findings be applied by others and to future research?

Other key tips for writing your abstract.

- Avoid using abbreviations and acronyms
- Use active voice
- Write the abstract as a separate document, not a series of copy/paste from the full paper
- Use keywords (and define them if needed)
- Edit, proofread, and review your abstract
- Ensure that the abstract is an accurate representation of the full paper
- Follow the word limit given in the submission instructions
- Write the abstract after the paper has been written (unless you are submitting an abstract for an inprogress research project where you will receive feedback from mentors).

Remember that the abstract is your hook to get others to read your full paper. A well-written abstract will draw in your audience and capture their attention. A great abstract can entice the audience to read your work and stimulate additional research in the topic area.
